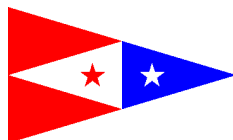

2020 FIREWORKS FOLLY PURSUIT RACE Saturday, July 4

NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club, Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 40 is changed as follows: All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed.
- 1.3 The sailing instructions may change additional racing rules.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The race is open to all monohull sailboats owned or skippered by an SFYC Member over 18 feet long with a valid NCPHRF certificate (except for boats in classes with established NCPHRF one-design ratings and fleets).
- 2.2 Eligible boats shall enter by registering online at www.sfyc.org > On the Water > Regattas.
- 2.3 There is no entry fee.
- 2.4 All crewmembers on all boats shall provide their name and contact information, in order to agree to the online waiver in the registration process.
- 2.5 Skippers shall read, and by registering agree to, the online Marin County Health Order Acknowledgement in the registration process, and thereby shall sail with crew that meets all included current requirements. It is each boat's responsibility to meet those requirements.
- 2.6 No entries will be accepted after 1200 hours on July 3.

3 SCHEDULE

- 3.1 Boats will start at staggered starting times, based on their individual handicaps from highest to lowest, beginning at 1030 hours, on July 4.
- 3.2 Starting times for boats entered will be posted at SFYC on the official notice board and on the website, www.sfyc.org, by 1600 hours on July 3.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available on July 3 at SFYC and on the website, www.sfyc.org.

5 THE COURSE

- 5.1 The course will be from the starting line, in the vicinity of the green channel marker in front of CYC (Fl G 4s 15ft “1”), around the following marks:
- YRA 16 “Blackaller” to port
 - YRA 8 to port
- Finishing back at the starting area.
- 5.2 The course will be 10.5 nautical miles long and described in full in the sailing instructions.

6 SCORING

- 6.1 Boats in classes with established NCPHRF one-design ratings and fleets will be assigned their one-design class NCPHRF base rating.
- 6.2 All other boats shall provide a current copy of their NCPHRF certificate, and will receive that rating.
- 6.3 The winner and finishing places will be determined by the order of finish.

7 BERTHING

The SFYC guest docks will be open to boats after the race on a first come, first served basis.

8 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 8.1 There will be no race committee on station, but boats are requested to monitor VHF channel 65A in order to communicate with each other in the event of an emergency.
- 8.2 Except in an emergency, or when retiring from a race, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

9 PRIZES

No trophies will be awarded.

10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
