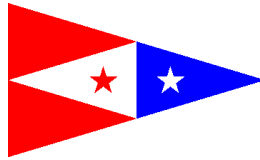

INVITATIONAL RESIN REGATTA

April 13 - 14, 2019

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club, Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 40 is changed as follows: All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed.
- 1.3 Appendix V1 (Penalty at the Time of an Incident) shall apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located outside on the west wall of the SFYC Clubhouse. The NOR, SIs, and amendments thereto will be posted online at www.sfyc.org

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hours on the day before it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the main flagpole located adjacent to the clubhouse.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in race signal AP.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday – Three (3) races are scheduled for all classes.

Sunday – Two (2) races are scheduled with the first warning signal at 1200 hours. No warning signal will be made after 1530 hours.

6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be numeral pennants:

<u>Class</u>	<u>Flag (Pennant)</u>
J/24	One
Knarr	Two
Folkboat	Three
Cal 20	Four

7 RACING AREA

The intended racing area will be in the vicinity of the Berkeley Olympic Circle.

8 COURSES

All courses are described in **Attachment A**. The course to be sailed will be designated by numeral placards displayed on the race committee signal boat.

9 MARKS

- 9.1 All marks will be inflatable buoys.
- 9.2 Marks W and L will be red.

10 THE START

- 10.1 Classes may be started in any order, although in the first race each day, the classes will be started in the order listed in instruction 6 above. One or more classes may not be participating, in which case their starting sequence will be skipped.
- 10.2 The starting line will be between a staff or halyard displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and a yellow inflatable buoy.

11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position and signal this change in accordance with rule 33.

12 THE FINISH

- 12.1 The DOWNWIND finishing line will be the same as the starting line described in SI 10.2.
- 12.2 The UPWIND finishing line will be between a staff or halyard displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat and a nearby yellow inflatable buoy set to windward of Mark W as shown in Attachment A.

13 TIME LIMITS

The time limit for each fleet for the first boat to sail the course and finish is 90 minutes. Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat in their fleet sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF. This changes rules 35 and A4 and A5.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1 Protest forms are available at the Regatta Table inside the clubhouse near the deck entrance. Protests, request for redress and request to reopen a hearing shall be filed at the Regatta Table within the applicable time limit. If filed after the close of the regatta table, filing shall be made to the front office. This changes rule 61.3.
- 14.2 The protest time is 60 minutes after the race committee signal boat docks. The time limit will be posted on the official notice board.
- 14.3 Notices will be posted on the official notice board within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearing in which they are parties.

15 SCORING

- 15.1 Two races must be completed to constitute a series.
- 15.2 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. No scores will be excluded.

16 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 16.1 The race committee may use VHF USA channel 65A to communicate information about the races.
- 16.2 The race committee will attempt to hail boats observed OCS at the start. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, the hail of some but not all OCS boats, the untimely hail of some or all OCS boats, or failure to hail any or all boats shall not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.
- 16.3 Except in an emergency, or retiring from a race, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions or receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

17 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded after the racing on Sunday, April 14 on the SFYC deck.

18 BERTHING

The SFYC guest dock will be available to participants from April 12 through April 14.

19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regatta.

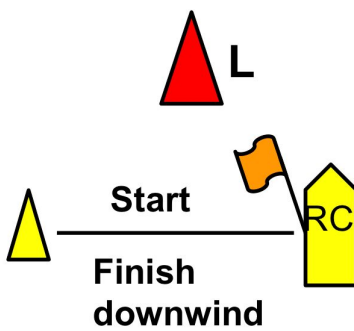
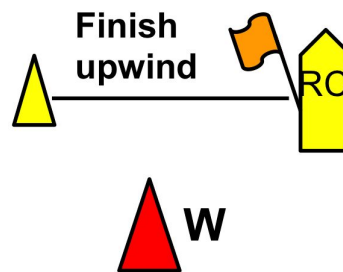
SOCIAL EVENTS
