



2019 Perkins Corporate Challenge Regatta October 19

NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club (SFYC), Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS.)
- 1.2 The rules do not govern the navigation of non-participating vessels, which may be met during the course of racing. Competitors should exercise due caution so that there be no violation of the applicable international or inland navigation and right-of-way rules.
- 1.3 Rule 40 is changed as follows: All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except for brief periods while changing or adjusting clothing. Flag Y will not be displayed.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all teams that are invited by the 2019 Leukaemia Cup Committee. A J/22 will be chartered and supplied to each team. There will be a maximum of 4 sailors per team and no crew weight limit.
- 2.2 Boats will be chartered by the Organizing Authority from the St. Francis Yacht Club, and may require signing of a separate waiver after entry is completed.

- 2.4 Entries will not be accepted after 1700 hours on Thursday, October 3.

3 FEES

The entry fee of \$25,000 will be donated to the Greater Bay Area Chapter of The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 There will be a competitors' meeting at the St. Francis Yacht Club at 1000 hours.
- 4.2 The regatta will have a maximum of five races, with the first warning signal at 1200 hours.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 Sailing instructions will be available by 1700 hours on Friday, October 18 at the SFYC Clubhouse and at www.sfyc.org.
- 5.2 Copies of the sailing instructions may be obtained at the Competitors' Meeting.

6 RACING AREA AND COURSES

- 6.1 Racing will take place west of Alcatraz.
- 6.2 Courses will be described in the sailing instructions.

7 SCORING

One race is required to be completed to constitute a series. A boat's series scores will be the total of her race scores. No scores will be excluded. This changes racing rule A2.

8 COMMUNICATIONS

The race committee may use VHF USA channel 65A to communicate information about the races.

9 AWARDS

On Saturday, October 19, the Perkins Challenge trophy will be awarded at the Leukemia Cup VIP Gala at Corinthian Yacht Club.

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
