SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

(NOR attached at end of SIs)

1 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1200 on the day before it will take effect.

2 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors, other than those related to hearings, will be posted on the official notice board located outside on the west wall of the SFYC Clubhouse.
- 2.2 The NOR, SIs, and amendments thereto will also be posted online at www.sfyc.org. The hearing schedule and related information will also be posted online.
- 2.3 The race committee may use VHF USA channel 65A to communicate information about the races.
- 2.4 Except in an emergency, or when retiring from a race, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

3 COURSES AND MARKS

The courses and marks are described in Attachment A.

4 THE START AND FINISH

- 4.1 The starting and finishing lines will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and a red inflatable mark, in the vicinity south or east of Corinthian Yacht Club, unless the racing area is moved to Richardson Bay. The racing area will be decided and described at the competitors' meeting.
- 4.2 The races will be started using RRS Appendix U (Audible-Signal Racing System).

5 TIME LIMITS

- 5.1 The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish each race is 60 minutes.
- 5.2 Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

6 HEARING REQUESTS

- 6.1 Hearing requests shall be submitted by email to <u>race@sfyc.org</u> by 1800 hours on July 8.
- 6.2 Hearings will be scheduled, in the approximate order of submission, online at a time scheduled by the protest committee during the week following the races, and take place on Zoom at the direction of the chief judge..

BP – Belvedere Point Bell Buoy

W - Yellow inflatable set as Weather Mark

L – Red inflatable set as Leeward Mark (same as Start/Finish mark)

All marks are rounding marks, except L when it is part of the Starting or Finishing line. All rounding marks shall be left to port.

NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club, Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 40.1 will apply at all times when boats are in the racing area, and on their way to and from the racing area.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available by 1600 hours on July 5 on The San Francisco Yacht Club website at www.sfyc.org and at the Competitors' Meeting.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.2 On the water the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio channel USA 65A.
- 3.3 While racing, except in an emergency or when retiring from a race, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The regatta is open to all Mercury Class sailboats. This regatta will be a counter in the Travel Trophy Series.
- 4.2 Eligible boats shall enter online at <u>www.SFYC.org</u> under On the Water > Regattas and pay by credit card, by 1000 hours on July 8.
- 4.3 The entry fee is \$30.

5 RACE SCHEDULE

Five races are scheduled.

Saturday, July 8 0900-1000 hours Launching

1000 hours Competitors' Meeting at Youth picnic tables
1100 hours First Warning Signal, additional races to follow
After Racing Trophy Presentation at Youth picnic tables

6 VENUE

The racing area will be in Raccoon Strait or Richardson Bay, depending on conditions and forecast.

7 COURSES AND MARKS

The courses and marks will be described in the sailing instructions, and will be windward-leeward type.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

Appendix V1 (Penalty at the Time of an Incident) shall apply.

9 SCORING

A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. No scores will be excluded.

10 RISK STATEMENT

Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk and subject to the terms and conditions of the SFYC liability waiver.

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

11 PRIZES

The Hart Nunes Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the regatta. Keeper trophies will be awarded to the top two boats.
